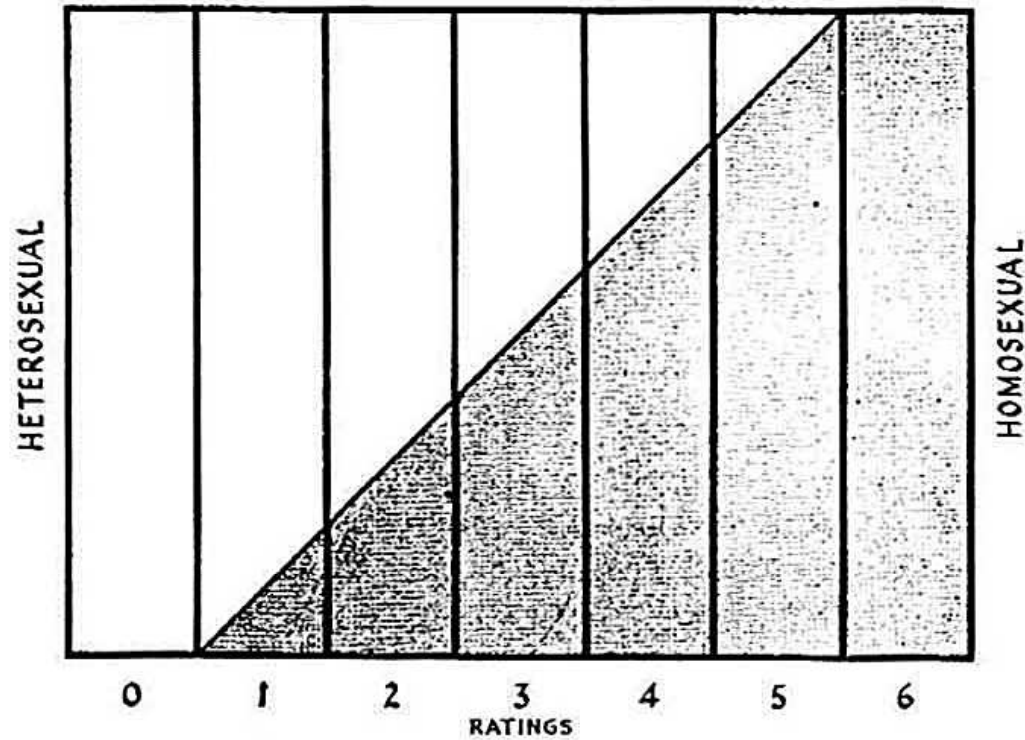


Kinsey Sexual Orientation Scale



Based on both psychologic reactions and overt experience, individuals rate as follows:

0. Exclusively heterosexual with no homosexual
1. Predominantly heterosexual, only incidentally homosexual
2. Predominantly heterosexual, but more than incidentally homosexual
3. Equally heterosexual and homosexual
4. Predominantly homosexual, but more than incidentally heterosexual
5. Predominantly homosexual, but incidentally heterosexual
6. Exclusively homosexual

People rate themselves on a 7-point scale from 1 to 7 as follows:

For variables A to E.:

1. = Other sex only
2. = Other sex mostly
3. = Other sex somewhat more
4. = Both sexes equally
5. = Same sex somewhat more
6. = Same sex mostly
7. = Same sex only

For variables F. and G.:

1. = Hetero only
2. = Hetero mostly
3. = Hetero somewhat more
4. = Hetero/gay-Lesb. equally
5. = Gay-Lesb. somewhat more
6. = Gay-Lesb. mostly
7. = Gay-Lesb. only
